# Gen-Z Movement in Nepal: What happened so far!



12 September 2025

- Former Chief Justice Sushila Karki has been appointed as the Prime Minister of Nepal's Interim Government, making her the country's first female Prime Minister. President Ram Chandra Paudel has agreed to [dissolve the House of Representatives](#) and declared a state of emergency under Article 273(1) of the constitution.
- According to the Ministry of Health and Population, the [death toll](#) from the Gen-Z movement has reached 51. Out of 1,760 injured, [322](#) remain hospitalized and 28 of them in critical condition in ICU.
- Preliminary assessments of [damage](#) at Singha Durbar show that while several key ministries, including Home and Education, sustained heavy destruction, some—such as Defence, Tourism, Industries and Commerce, Foreign Affairs, and Law—escaped major harm. The new Home Ministry building, where relocation had not yet begun, also remains intact.
- The Hotel Association Nepal reported that the hospitality sector [suffered](#) losses exceeding NPR 25 billion during the 9 September unrest, with Kathmandu's Hilton Hotel alone facing damages estimated at over NPR 8 billion.
- The Nepal Army has retrieved [268 weapons](#) that demonstrators had looted from Nepal Police across various parts of the country.

### More to know,

- The Department of Immigration has introduced [temporary](#) measures to ease visa and departure procedures.
- Public bus services, which had been [halted](#) following the curfew on September 9, have gradually resumed operations.
- Nepal police has asked the public to coordinate and cooperate with the police on [finding individuals](#) involved in looting, arson and other violent activities.
- The custom offices in Birgunj and Biratnagar is resuming its operations.
